DUQUESNE LIGHT'S WATT CHOICES INCENTIVE PROGRAM DETAILS

Duquesne Light offers several programs for public sector facilities:

Public Agency Partnership Program (PAPP)

Program Summary: Provides eligible facilities with recommendations and incentives for the installation of energy efficiency equipment.

Eligible Facilities: Federal, state and local governments, municipalities, school districts, institutions of higher education, non-profit entities, water and wastewater agencies, and other public entities.

Incentive Structure: Prescriptive (catalog-based) and custom rebates to reduce the out of pocket cost for the installation of energy efficiency equipment.

Eligible Measures: Include lighting, HVAC, office equipment, and related systems.

Program Administrator: MCR Performance Solutions

Community Education Energy Efficiency Program (CEEP)

Program Summary: Provides training to prepare middle and high school students to become energy efficiency auditors to perform audits at school facilities and in community small businesses.

Eligible Facilities: School districts within Duquesne Light's service territory.

Incentive Structure: Provides training and education for teachers and students for energy efficiency audits. The student team will create reports and action plans to implement energy efficiency within the community. In addition, projects that are installed as a result of the plan will be eligible for rebates.

Program Administrator: MCR Performance Solutions

Program Terms and Conditions

Facility must have an active Duquesne Light customer account.

Customer incentives are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Qualified measures must be installed at facilities served by Duquesne Light and be installed after June 1, 2016. If you are receiving tax credits, state funding or federal funding for the same project, you are *still eligible* to apply for the Duquesne Light rebate.

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- Invest in energy efficiency improvements for your facility
- Receive incentives for purchase and installation of energy efficiency equipment
- Reduce your energy usage and electric bills

PA ACT 129 – QUICK FACTS ON HOW IT WORKS FOR YOUR FACILITY

Act 129 requires Duquesne Light, and the other electric distribution companies in Pennsylvania, to develop cost-effective plans that will reduce electricity consumption. Duquesne Light's plan to meet these requirements, Watt Choices, has been in operation since 2009. This third phase of the program covers the period of June 1, 2016 – May 31, 2021.
